# The Why, When, Who, Where and What



### WHY ARE PPSN/VINs NOW REQUIRED?

A new requirement to provide a **Personal Public Service Number** ("PPSN") or **Verified Identity Number** ("VIN") to the **Companies Registration Office** ("CRO") came into effect pursuant to Section 35 of the *Companies (Corporate Enforcement Authority) Act 2021* ("2021 Act") which amended the *Companies Act 2014* ("2014 Act"), and requires the inclusion of a PPSN/VIN for all directors of Irish companies when submitting the CRO filings identified below.

The inclusion of directors' PPSN/VINs will validate a director's identity, highlight instances where directors are holding more directorships than permitted under the 2014 Act, and reduce the risk of identity theft.

### WHEN DOES THIS REQUIREMENT COME INTO PLACE?

A director's PPSN or VIN is required for certain CRO filings from <u>23 April 2023</u>. Therefore, companies or presenters (if applicable) need to ensure that <u>all</u> directors have either a PPSN or VIN *in advance of the next applicable filing* with the CRO and that each director's personal information matches that held by the Department of Social Protection ("DSP").

### WHO DOES THIS REQUIREMENT APPLY TO?

This requirement applies to all Irish companies providing director information within the following CRO filings:

- Form A1 Incorporation of a New Company
- Form B1 Annual Return
- Form B10 Appointment or Resignation of a Director, or change of details
- Form B69 Notice by a Director of Cessation of Office where a company has failed to file a Form B10

(together referred to as the "Relevant CRO Filings")

## WHERE WILL MY PPSN/VIN BE STORED AND HOW WILL IT BE VERIFIED?

The CRO will retain all PPSN/VIN data provided in a secure, irreversible hashed/encrypted format. Once submitted, it will not be accessible by any member of the CRO or any other party and will never be shared with a third party.

A PPSN will be compared with the data held by the DSP. For there to be a match between the two sets of data, the forename and surname submitted to the CRO via the Relevant CRO Filing *must exactly match* the name associated with that PPSN on the DSP's database.

If a RBO number was previously obtained for you (in conjunction with the filing of a Beneficial Ownership Register) this number will be re-classified within the CRO in advance of 23 April and can be used as the VIN.

Here at FCS Services, we are GDPR compliant and will securely retain any PPSN/VIN data provided to us with such information only being accessible and used when making Relevant CRO Filings on behalf of clients.

#### WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR ME?

- Directors' PPSNs (or VINS once obtained/reclassified) will need to be included on all A1's, B1's, B10's and B69's effective 23 April 2023 onwards.
- **PPSNs will be encrypted** once submitted to the CRO to ensure security of data.
- A verification exercise will need to be conducted to ensure the personal information provided to the CRO matches exactly that held by the DSP or attached to a RBO number.
- If you do not already hold a PPSN/RBO number, a VIN will need to be obtained.
- This new requirement should provide additional security for directors in terms of identity and/or company theft or fraud.
- Failure to comply with Section 35 of the 2021 Act, and the CRO requirements associated to it, will be a Category 4 offence under the 2014 Act and is punishable by the imposition of a Class A fine (i.e. a fine not exceeding €5,000).
